

St Peters Academy Remote Learning Curriculum Coverage

Reception

Literacy – Traditional Tales including Little Red Riding Hood, The 3 Little Pigs and Goldilocks and the 3 bears. The children have been practicing their sequencing, retelling and predicting skills.

Maths – Introducing '0', number bonds to 5 and comparing height, weight and capacity.

Topic/Science -Uses of Everyday Materials linked to literacy work. E.g. investigating which is the best material to build a house from in the 3 Little Pigs.

R.E. – Why are some stories special? Investigating stories from the Bible and the Quran.

Art – An artist study of Giuseppe Archimboldi including creating their own 'fruit and vegetable' inspired pictures.

PSHE - The focus is on health and well-being

Year 1

Literacy – Prince Cinders narrative unit of work from Literacy Shed.

Talk for writing 'Pippity Skycap' a unit of work based on poetry.

'Dog's Don't Do Ballet' – a Literacy Shed narrative writing unit.

Maths – Place value within 20, addition and subtraction within 20 and 2-d/3-d shape work.

Topic/Science – Uses of everyday materials including practical activities to investigate floating/sinking and absorbency.

R.E. – What do Muslims believe?

Art – An artist study of Henri Matisse.

PSHE - The focus is on health and well-being

Year 2

Literacy - Diary writing to link with Great Fire of London topic.

Talk for writing units – The Elves and the Shoemaker and Superheroes.

Maths – Multiplication/Division and Statistics.

Topic – The Great Fire Of London including timeline activities, investigating buildings, designing and making buildings.

Science – Uses of Everyday materials.

R.E. - 'Rules and Routines from different world faiths - this will cover 'our rules', the 10 commandments and aspects of Judaism, Sikhism, Islam and Humanism.

Art – An artist study of Vincent Van Gogh.

PSHE - The focus is on health and well-being – and the topic is 'Think Positive'

Year 3

Literacy – Narrative writing linked to the class text 'Stone Age Boy' and newspaper reports.

Maths – Multiplication/Division and Money

Topic – The Stone Age including chronology, what Stone Age people wore, what they ate, cave paintings etc.

Science – Animals including humans with a focus on healthy diets and digestion.

R.E. - Similarities and differences between Islam and Christianity, including how Islam began and the key features of a mosque.

Art – An artist study of Vincent Van Gogh.

PSHE - The focus is on health and well-being.

Year 4

Literacy – Narrative writing linked to the class text 'James and the Giant Peach.

Talk for writing unit – Impossibly Possible.

Maths – Multiplication and division methods (recap mental methods and then moving on to more formal written methods).

Topic – The Slave Trade including mapping skills and the history of the Slave Trade.

R.E. - Judaism - What can we learn from a synagogue?

Art – An artist study of Vincent Van Gogh.

PSHE - The focus is on health and well-being.

Year 5

Literacy – Writing unit from literacy shed based on our class novel 'Room 13' - creating a toolkit for suspense writing and then having a go at writing a 'nightmare' sequence using the features we identified.

Talk for Writing booklet - 'Treasure' which continues the 'suspense and mystery' narrative genre.

Talk for writing booklet – 'Wizards' which is a persuasive writing unit of work.

Maths – Multiplication/division written methods and lots of work on decimal numbers including addition/subtraction, ordering and rounding.

Topic – Early Islamic Civilisations including a study of the importance of Baghdad during this time period.

Science – Earth and Beyond

R.E. – The Five Pillars of Islam linking with our topic work.

Art – An artist study of Pablo Picasso.

PSHE - The focus is on health and well-being.

ICT – Coding using the 'Hour of Code' resources on Code.org

Year 6

Literacy – Talk for writing unit ‘Gadgets’ which is a persuasive writing topic.

Talk for writing unit ‘Treasure’ which focuses on narrative and the tools needed for mystery/suspense writing.

Maths – Multiplication/division written methods including decimal numbers, finding percentages of amounts and comparing fractions, decimals and percentages.

Topic – Vikings including looking at examples of Viking artefacts and creating their own.

Science - Animals including humans with a focus on classification.

R.E. – What does it mean to live as a Jew today? including Judaism in the community.

Art – An artist study of Pablo Picasso.

PSHE - The focus is on health and well-being.

ICT – Coding using the ‘Hour of Code’ resources on Code.org

All classes are setting daily handwriting and phonics/spelling activities.

All classes are continuing to practice times tables and key maths skills daily through focused tasks and TT Rockstars.
